We are especially proud to recognize the 40th anniversary of President Johnson's War on Poverty. Unfortunately, this war is still ongoing, but our Community Action Agencies and Head Start Programs continue to be at the forefront of the battle to improve the lives of Oklahoma's low-income families.

This Annual Report provides concrete information regarding that ongoing war on poverty. Individual agency and consolidated statewide data reflect our combined missions to combat the causes of poverty for Oklahoma's low-income residents through our various programs.

We hope you as the recipient of this publication will find the information on specific programs in each agency useful in your own endeavors. We'd also ask that you assist potential clients for our essential services by directing them to the agency or program that can best assist them, so they don't go through the hassle of being shuffled from organization to organization.

All of Oklahoma's 77 counties are served by community action agencies. Through the federally mandated board structure, each local governing board consists of local public officials, democratically selected representatives of the poor, and representatives from area private organizations. In partnership with the board, the agency collaborates with other essential service providers at the local, county, regional and state level to ensure the delivery of quality, effective services.

Community Action: Helping People. Changing Lives.

During the last program year, Community Action Agencies in Oklahoma mobilized the resources of over 3,750 employees and over \$179.3 million in federal, state and local funds to provide services to thousands of low-income families. Oklahoma's Community Action Agencies:

PROVIDED EMERGENCY SERVICES TO OKLAHOMANS

- Assisted 4,063 clients with utility bills
- Provided 1,206 clients with rent payment assistance
- Gave 10,079 clients food from agency food pantries
- Provided 962 persons assistance in obtaining medical services or prescriptions
- Assisted 655 victims of domestic abuse

GAVE CHILDREN IN OKLAHOMA A HEAD START IN EDUCATION

- In 578 classrooms located throughout the state, served over 10,921 children, ages 0-5, by improving their readiness for school and helping them grow mentally, socially, emotionally and physically

OPERATED NUTRITION PROGRAMS ACROSS OKLAHOMA

- Served 551,495 meals to senior citizens at 53 nutrition centers
- Delivered 435,420 meals to seniors in their homes

CONDUCTED PROGRAMS FOR OKLAHOMA'S LOW-INCOME YOUTH

- Served 909 youngsters through the Foster Grandparents Program
- Provided summer programs for 4,165 youth

SERVED AS A PRIMARY HOME DEVELOPMENT SOURCE

- Weatherized 1,219 houses to reduce energy costs for low-income families
- Rehabilitated 86 houses into safe, sanitary places to live
- Constructed 122 new houses for low and moderate-income families
- Provided homebuyer education classes for 845 clients

PROVIDED PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION PRIMARILY IN RURAL OKLAHOMA

- Using a fleet of 444 vehicles, made 1,767,583 passenger trips taking residents to jobs, medical appointments, school and other places
- Provided transportation for 95 Road to Work routes to jobs

SERVED OKLAHOMANS IN POVERTY WITH AN ARRAY OF OTHER PROGRAMS

- Referred 24,706 persons to other social service or governmental agencies for assistance
- Helped 2,006 clients prepare their income tax returns
- Provided job counseling/training to 2,193 persons
- Made 16 loans to help establish businesses
- Assisted 519 persons obtain their general equivalency diploma
- Helped 40 persons establish Individual Development Accounts to save for major purchases such as a house
- Assisted 838 persons with chemical abuse counseling
- 260 individuals received business development assistance
- Provided opportunities for 3,502 senior citizens to participate in the Retired and Senior Volunteers Program

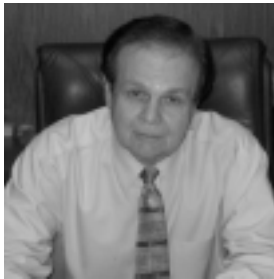

Conferences & Training

Providing on-going training opportunities for professional staff, volunteer board members, and Head Start parents at quarterly conferences is a key program for the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA).

The annual conference held Sept. 24-25, 2003, brought over 185 people together in Oklahoma City for training on tax assistance for rural areas, mentoring in the classroom, web site development, child support enforcement, playground equipment requirements, presentation skills, and indirect costs versus direct costs. More than 200 Community Action Agency employees were recognized for years of service, including seven who had served 35 years.

Kathryn Taylor, Secretary of Commerce, was the keynote speaker during the general session at the Winter Conference held Dec. 3-5, 2003, in Tulsa. Registration reached 175 plus nearly 30 more parents of Head Start children. The conference featured the first in the series of full-day management training sessions on developing creative problem solving skills. Human resources staff attended sessions on employee orientation, working with files, conducting an interview, and self-funding insurance.

OKACAA's 2004 Legislative Conference, held Mar. 29-31, 2004, in Oklahoma City, featured program exhibits in the rotunda of the State Capitol Building. Derrick Span, National President of the Community Action Partnership, brought his anti-poverty message to Oklahoma and challenged the more than 180 conference registrants to attend a "No Room for Poverty" national rally in Washington, D.C. on Sept. 4. Training tracks were provided for food program, housing, Head Start, and other staff members, plus volunteer board of director members. Management training focused on challenges of supervision.

More than 170 registered for the Summer Conference that was held May 27-28, 2004, in Oklahoma City. Housing staff training centered in rehabilitation efforts and counseling. Head Start directors and staff attended sessions on communications, teacher certification regulations, managing the aggressive child, and dealing with childhood grief. Food program personnel learned about menu planning and food safety. Disability staff members were provided an overview on planning for transition of children with developmental delays from early intervention programs to community programs. Management training dealt with delegation and control.

Head Start Coordination

The Association provided technical assistance and training to Oklahoma's Head Start programs through a contract with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. Activities included sponsorship of self-assessment teams for each agency scheduled for federal review in the coming year. Staff also had monthly meetings with Head Start Program Directors, disseminated information and discussed current issues using an internet-based information system, and coordinated with other groups and networks to ensure the Head Start programs were acknowledged as viable community services for their constituencies.

A primary component of the Head Start Coordination program, funded by an appropriation from the State Legislature, is the Self-Assessment Assistance Model System (SAAMS). The Association brings together teams of experts in the areas of financial management, health care, mental health, disabilities, education and curriculum, program design and management. These teams work with local agencies to meet Head Start's self-assessment requirements and prepare the agencies for upcoming federal program reviews. This past year, three Head Start programs in two community action agencies and one other agency received SAAMS team assessments.

Head Start Collaboration

During the past year, the Oklahoma's Head Start Collaboration Project focused on efforts to provide low-income children access to comprehensive services, encourage collaborative efforts, and promote involvement in development of state plans and policies.

To help build early childhood systems and access to comprehensive services for all low-income children, four new partnerships were developed with public schools including one with a career-technology center.

Six new partnerships were created between Community Action Agencies and Head Start programs to assist low-income families prepare their tax returns and obtain the Earned Income Tax Credit. Over 2,000 tax returns were completed with a total Earned Income Tax Credit topping \$1.6 million.

All 35 Head Start grantees were provided information on a \$1 monthly phone service available to eligible families living on Indian land; nine agencies either had a plan or were developing a plan to assist families in accessing this program.

The efforts to encourage widespread collaboration between Head Start and other appropriate programs centered on several programs. To improve access to health care, the project worked with partners to establish a Public Health Institute to receive funding on behalf of the statewide Turning Point community health initiative to assist local communities in developing partnership to improve access to health service.

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA), in collaboration with the Oklahoma Primary Care Association, convened a one-day forum to develop an action plan to improve access to oral health for Early Head Start and Head Start children and their families. This led to creation of an Oral Health Subcommittee of the Oklahoma Health Improvement Partnership. This group has developed oral health tip sheets and contact information for Head Start Directors. It also prepared an information paper describing two new laws enabling greater access to services of dental assistants and dental hygienists for distribution to dentists and Head Start Directors.

The project was represented on the reactivated Oklahoma Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program Advisory Board. The Board is developing a plan that includes working with Head Start programs to eliminate the causes of childhood lead poisoning.

Project staff worked with state officials, tribal and regional Head Start representatives and childcare representatives to develop a state "Early Learning Guidelines" that aligned with requirements of all early childhood programs. The State Board of Education adopted these guidelines.

To facilitate Head Start's involvement in the development of state policies, plans, processes, and decisions, Community Action Executive Directors and the OKACAA Executive Director met with legislators and staff to familiarize them on needs and collaboration efforts. The project director helped develop a position paper regarding childcare subsidy. The project also supported development and distribution of a Childcare Portfolio – a fact book on childcare and Head Start in Oklahoma.

Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities

The Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities is a five-year pilot project supported by the Oklahoma Developmental Disabilities Council. The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies is the project administrator. The purpose of the project is to assist people with disabilities purchase a home.

The pilot, now in its fourth year, is providing funding to six Community Housing Development Organizations. Each pilot agency is responsible for marketing, providing homebuyer education and counseling, assisting with loan applications, identifying community supports, post-ownership counseling for two years, and maintaining client databases. During the program's third year of operation, 118 people were provided one-on-one counseling and 20 ultimately became first time home owners.

Homebuyer Education

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association continued to grow with membership at the end of the OHEA membership year at 208. OHEA has certified 169 Homebuyer Education Professionals representing 17 community action agencies, 20 housing authorities (10 tribal and 10 municipal), 12 lenders, 8 nonprofits, three real estate companies, and three municipalities. OHEA expanded its program interests this year by becoming a founding member of the Oklahoma Jump\$tart Coalition for Financial Literacy and partnering with Oklahoma Head Start to offer financial literacy training.

OHEA signed the Memorandum of Understanding formally instituting the Oklahoma African American Home Ownership Initiative and joined with the OAAHOI in a faith-based Housing Fair in Oklahoma City. Pastors from twenty-three congregations discussed stewardship opportunities on Homeownership Sunday, and the following Saturday forty area businesses and agencies presented their services at a housing fair to assist people in achieving homeownership. Director of Homebuyer Education Programs Tricia Auberle presented the need for homebuyer education to over 400 participants. A similar event is planned for the Tulsa area in the coming year. OHEA continued to partner with the Oklahoma Developmental Disabilities Council and the Oklahoma Real Estate Commission to deliver continuing education on Fair Housing for Persons with Disabilities. The six-hour class was offered in Oklahoma City and six rural locations.

The First Annual Homebuyer Education Conference exceeded expectations with 109 in attendance out of 128 pre-registered. Presentations by Congressman Frank Lucas and Oklahoma Treasurer Robert Butkin lead the program that also included sessions on Best Practices, Regulatory Issues and the African American Home Ownership Initiative. The Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka was recognized with the first "Friend of OHEA" award at the Membership Meeting and Awards Luncheon. OHEA Awards for Excellence in Homebuyer Education Practices were given to Little Dixie Community Action Agency, Stillwater Partners for Affordable Housing and Housing Partners of Tulsa.

Poverty Awareness

A combined annual report and directory developed by OKACAA supported its efforts to educate Oklahomans about the efforts of Community Action Agencies to address the obstacles facing low-income families who are striving to become self-reliant. The report featured statistical information about agency programs along with key contacts and service locations. The publication is a resource for policy makers, state and federal agency officials, allied organizations, and others who serve the low-income population.

OKACAA provided training for volunteer board members at three agencies on their responsibilities. Training for staff on the use of PowerPoint software and improving presentation skills was provided at two agencies. In addition, a presentation on housing programs was made at the Oklahoma Conference on Aging.

Community Action Solutions, the association's bimonthly newsletter, continued to feature articles on a variety of programs conducted by agencies. The newsletter is distributed to state legislators, executive branch officials, state agency administrators, members of Oklahoma's congressional delegation, news media, Department of Human Services county directors and other groups. In addition, OKACAA maintained a internet web site to provide additional information.

Hand-N-Hand

OG&E Electric Services and OKACAA formed a partnership to improve the lives of senior citizens who are OG & E customers who are in need of weatherization assistance but whose income excludes them from income-based assistance.

OG&E is providing a \$20,000 grant and OKACAA is administering the program. The grant will enable Community Action Agencies to weatherize 20-25 homes.

Energy Star

The U.S. Department of Energy provided funding through the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to promote the national Energy Star program. Energy Star is an innovative energy efficiency program sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Through efficient building practices and materials, Energy Star helps homebuyers save money on monthly utility bills while reducing air pollution.

OKACAA promoted the program through distribution of information at the Tulsa House Beautiful and Oklahoma City Home and Garden Show. In addition, the Association distributed information through displays in malls in Ardmore, Bartlesville, Enid, Lawton, and Muskogee.

Affiliated Housing Organizations

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies administers three housing-related organizations that are tied to its mission of assisting Oklahoma's low income families. Each statewide organization works in different ways to promote homeownership and other housing issues, and brings together a broad coalition of individuals dedicated to helping people, changing lives.

Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association (OHEA) is a statewide coalition of nonprofit and business partners managed by the OKACAA that promotes the basic American family values of security, self-sufficiency, and community by enabling a diversity of Oklahomans to pursue homeownership. Down payment, special loan products and other financial assistance for lower- and middle-income families is often tied to homebuyer education. Homebuyer education protects prospective homebuyers by providing them with a process for making good decisions about whether to buy and what to buy, as well as how to work with real estate and mortgage professionals. It acquaints them with their rights under fair credit and fair housing legislation and their responsibilities to protect themselves and their investments. It teaches them to use their earnings and credit history to make a solid investment toward financial security and self sufficiency.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc.

Housing is a major issue for people with disabilities; they are often not given choices about where they live, or with whom and how they spend their time. They are among the most under-served groups in the mortgage and real estate industries, especially when they have lower incomes. Housing options generally consist of their families' homes, congregate facilities, group homes and nursing homes, where housing and services are inextricably linked.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., is a statewide organization developed by the Oklahoma Developmental Disabilities Council whose purpose is to increase the number of people with disabilities who have the opportunity to own their own home, and thereby gain independence and inclusion in the community. The Council continues to provide support funds for the group.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., is composed of representatives from various groups: people with disabilities, disabilities advocates, private lenders, real estate firms, state social service agencies, private nonprofits, and housing organizations. Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., serves as an advisory board for OKACAA's Affordable Homeownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities Program.

Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council

The Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council (OWHAC) is composed of representatives from the housing and weatherization programs operated by community action agencies. OWHAC's mission is to provide technical assistance and training to community action agencies in Oklahoma and to support and promote comfortable, safe, decent and affordable housing throughout the state.

OWHAC annually sponsors the Oklahoma Housing and Energy Conference, which provides training on topics such as electric and gas appliance base loads, rural housing finance, multifamily housing, credit issues, federal housing programs and programs for people with disabilities.

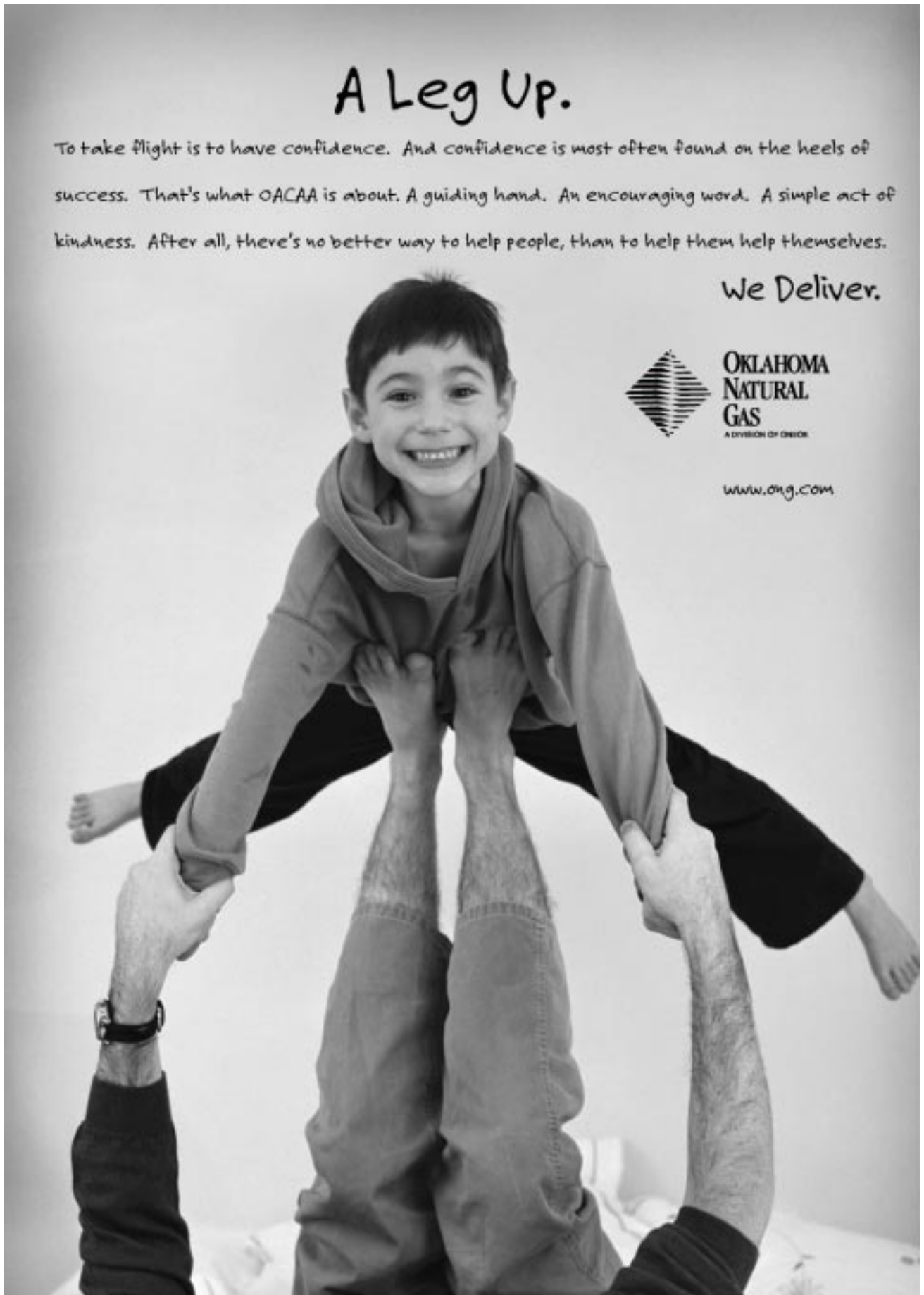
