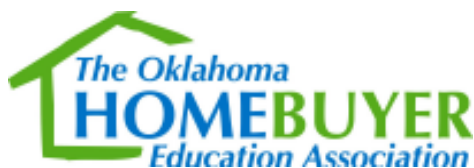

Helping people, changing lives. Community Action's motto is unusual in that it is also our primary job. Our broad array of services and programs are geared towards humanitarian needs including food, shelter, security and employment. Oklahoma's community action agencies are direct, person to person service providers that strive to positively impact our local communities' citizens that have the greatest need.

This Annual Report demonstrates the results of our local agencies' efforts this past year. You will find each one of our eighteen association members reported significant results in the various programs and services provided. Keep in mind that each number represents a real individual or family in need, a success story in breaking down the barriers caused by poverty.

Whether they were provided transportation to and from work or for medical care, counseled for credit worthiness to purchase their first home, or received emergency assistance with their utility bills, each of our success stories impacts your local community. The person walking by you on the street, sacking your groceries at the supermarket, or living down the block may have needed just a little help to overcome a hurdle in their path towards self-sufficiency.

We hope you will view Annual Report and the Directory information as a valuable resource. Each agency has a variety of programs, some unique, they offer in the one or more counties they serve. Community Action: Helping People. Changing Lives.

Community Action Agencies in Oklahoma last year mobilized the resources of over 4,500 full and part-time employees and over \$163 million in federal, state and other funds to provide services to thousands of low-income families. Oklahoma's Community Action Agencies:

PROVIDED EMERGENCY SERVICES TO OKLAHOMANS

- Assisted 3,460 clients with utility bills
- Provided 1,805 clients with rent payment assistance
- Provided 5,510 persons assistance in obtaining medical services or prescriptions

GAVE CHILDREN IN OKLAHOMA A HEAD START IN EDUCATION

- In 567 classrooms located throughout the state, served 11,868 children, ages 0-5, by improving their readiness for school and helping them grow mentally, socially, emotionally and physically
- Collaborated with 153 schools and 29 child care programs to more effectively use space and staff

OPERATED NUTRITION PROGRAMS ACROSS OKLAHOMA

- Served 626,602 meals to senior citizens at 64 nutrition centers
- Delivered 240,803 meals to seniors in their homes

SERVED AS A PRIMARY HOME DEVELOPMENT SOURCE

- Weatherized 1,513 houses to reduce energy costs for low-income families
- Rehabilitated 84 houses into safe, sanitary places to live
- Constructed 132 new houses for low and moderate-income families
- Constructed 76 multifamily housing units
- Made emergency repairs to 265 houses
- Provided homebuyer education classes for 1,709 clients

PROVIDED PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION PRIMARILY IN RURAL OKLAHOMA

- Using a fleet of 446 vehicles, made 3,191,397 passenger trips taking residents to jobs, medical appointments, school and other places
- Provided transportation on Road to Work routes to 490 businesses

HELPED LOW & MODERATE INCOME FAMILIES MANAGE THEIR MONEY

- Completed and electronically filed 6,287 federal tax returns resulting in \$7,593,624 in refunds
- Opened 40 Individual Development Accounts for clients to save for housing, education or business

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & JOB ASSISTANCE

- Provided business development assistance to 933 clients resulting in establishment of 141 new businesses or expansion of existing businesses and 216 jobs
- Funded job training for 897 persons
- Assisted 491 persons obtain their General Equivalency Diploma

SERVED OKLAHOMANS WITH AN ARRAY OF OTHER PROGRAMS

- Provided opportunities for 4,225 senior citizens to participate in the Retired and Senior Volunteers Program or Foster Grandparents Program
- Served 1,105 clients with services related to substance abuse

Conferences & Training

Providing on-going training opportunities for professional staff, volunteer board members, and Head Start parents at quarterly conferences is a key program for the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA).

The annual conference held Sept. 22-23, 2004, brought 200 people together in Oklahoma City for training tracks for human resources, nutrition and Head Start staff, and board members. The crowd swelled to 280 during the awards banquet where about 220 Community Action staffers were recognized for their years of service. The Association celebrated the 40th anniversary of Community Action during the conference.

The winter conference held Dec. 1-3, 2004, in Tulsa featured training on effective communications, financial literacy, Results Oriented Management and Accountability and the Earned Income Tax Credit program. About 185 people registered for the conference.

OKACAA's 2005 Legislative Conference, held Mar. 28-30, 2005, in Oklahoma City, included sessions on healthy eating habits, a prescription assistance program, behavioral challenges in infancy and toddlers, motivating performance and resource development. Nearly 160 persons registered for the conference.

Nearly 170 registered for the Summer Conference that was held June 9-10, 2005, in Oklahoma City. Training topics included down payment assistance, menu planning, managing conflict and human resources basics.

Head Start Coordination

A primary component of the Head Start Coordination program, funded by an appropriation from the State Legislature, is the Self-Assessment Assistance Model System (SAAMS). OKACAA brings together teams of experts in the areas of financial management, health care, mental health, disabilities, education and curriculum, program design and management. These teams work with local agencies to meet Head Start's self-assessment requirements and prepare the agencies for upcoming federal program reviews. This past year, 11 Head Start programs in eight Community Action agencies and three other agency received SAAMS team assessments.

OKACAA also provided technical assistance and training to Oklahoma's Head Start programs through a contract with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce. Staff met monthly with Head Start Program Directors, disseminated information and discussed current issues using an internet-based information system.

Head Start Collaboration

During the past year, the Oklahoma's Head Start Collaboration Project focused on efforts to help build early childhood systems and access to comprehensive services for all low-income children, and encouraged widespread collaboration between local community based Head Start programs and state early childhood initiatives and policies. To help build early childhood systems and access to comprehensive services for all low-income children, the Head Start State Collaboration Office:

- Awarded \$30,000 of project supplemental funding to the Oklahoma Partnership for School Readiness (Smart Start Oklahoma) to fund creation of a community mobilization team to act as liaison with 13 local communities in development of a "community approach to ensuring school readiness."
- Provided all 36 Head Start grantees information on the \$1 monthly phone service available to eligible families living on Indian land; nine agencies either had a plan or were developing a plan to assist families in accessing this program.

The Collaboration Project encouraged widespread collaboration between Head Start and other appropriate programs in the eight priority areas of the Project. Following are examples of positive results.

- *Improving access to health care services* by presenting Native American health survey findings at the “Working Together for the Community’s Health” workshop sponsored by the Oklahoma Health Care authority, Oklahoma Primary Care Association, Oklahoma Institute for Child Advocacy, and the Oklahoma City Area Inter-Tribal Health Board.
- *Improving availability, accessibility, and quality of early childhood programs* by hosting a statewide meeting of Head Start and other early childhood professionals to dialogue with regard to updated information about Head Start reauthorization and development of a more coordinated system of professional development.
- *Expanding and improving education opportunities in early childhood programs* by participating in planning the “Early Childhood Higher Education Articulation Summit” with the University of Oklahoma, and working with public and private institutions of higher education to familiarize Head Start directors with two-year and four-year early childhood degree programs to comply with requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act.
- *Improving collaboration among community partners* by preparing and distributing packets of materials on Community Action and Head Start programs and services to University of Oklahoma Masters Degree class in Educational and Community Renewal.
- *Improving access to family literacy services* by continuing participation in “Early Steps to Literacy” grant and participation in the follow-up “Building Bridges for Early Steps in Literacy,” a regional collaborative of early childhood partners meeting in Idabel, OK.
- *Improving opportunities for children with disabilities* by facilitating a merger of the State Dental Task Force, focused on dental services for children with disabilities, and the Oral Health Coalition to form the Children’s Oral Health Coalition.
- *Ensuring coordination of services and support for homeless children* by serving on the Governor’s Interagency Council on Homelessness and the subcommittee on Access to Mainstream Resources.
- *Improving collaboration with family support systems* by leading a state level group to develop two state interdisciplinary teams to pilot test the Head Start Bureau curriculum for training on domestic violence.

Oklahoma Asset Development Project

OKACAA, Oklahoma Department of Commerce (ODOC), Internal Revenue Services (IRS) and Oklahoma’s Community Action network began developing and expanding a program of asset development for the state’s low-income population. The goal is to create a comprehensive program over the three-year project period that will help participants take advantage of the federal and state earned income tax and child care tax credit programs, reduce the amount of their tax refunds that are siphoned off by high-cost financial services and educate those participants on how to more effectively manage their money for long-term asset development, including homeownership.

OKACAA, as the lead agency for the project, helped mobilize local agencies to develop earned income tax credit promotional outreach activities, begin new tax preparation services or expand existing services, and develop comprehensive financial literacy and asset development programs at the local level.

The IRS provided hands-on training and technical assistance to the 17 participating agencies to assist in setting up effective Volunteer Income Tax Assistance sites in their local service areas. OKACAA and the IRS assisted local agencies with marketing and outreach efforts for the free tax preparation services. A key part of the outreach efforts was to educate participants to avoid rapid refund services, which are actually high interest loans, and to question the high income tax preparation fees for a simple tax return. The local Community Action agencies provided the necessary staff, office space and other resources to manage the activities.

The financial literacy/financial services component of the project includes a number of activities to help participating individuals and families be able to make informed choices on how they budget and expend their limited funds.

The local agencies were asked to identify what types of asset-building and financial services they plan to offer in their service areas. Financial services are likely to include developing partnerships with community banks to provide services for low-income members of the community who frequently use high cost alternatives such as money orders, wire transfers and payday loans. Training was provided to agency coordinators on how to attract clients to additional financial services and asset-building programs, what asset-building programs are available, and what it takes to get additional programs in their service area.

Asset building activities may include choosing to partner with the Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association to provide homebuyer education training and develop homebuyer clubs, utilizing Individual Development Accounts if the local agency has that program in operation, and setting up college saving funds. For individuals with a disability, the local agency may be able to partner with the Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities program which offers intensive home ownership counseling, education and community support.

Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities

The Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities is a five-year pilot project supported by the Oklahoma Developmental Disabilities Council. OKACAA is the project administrator. The purpose of the project is to assist people with disabilities purchase a home.

The pilot, now in its fifth year, is providing funding to seven Community Housing Development Organizations. Each pilot agency is responsible for marketing, providing homebuyer education and counseling, assisting with loan applications, identifying community supports, providing post-ownership counseling for two years, and maintaining client databases. During the program's fourth year of operation, 198 people were provided one-on-one counseling and 84 ultimately became first time home owners.

Homebuyer Education

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association (OHEA) continues its mission to promote basic family values like security, self-sufficiency, and community by enabling a diversity of Oklahomans to pursue homeownership. A newly developed partnership with the NeighborWorks Center for Homeowner Education and Counseling will extend the association's outreach to regional and national training institutes. OHEA continues to partner with other housing and financial literacy programs to provide long-term solutions to poverty through asset-building opportunities. Partnerships include providing training and technical assistance to participants in the Oklahoma Asset Development Project and Affordable Home Ownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities.

The Second Annual Homebuyer Education Conference keynote speaker was Karen Hoskins, Curriculum Manger for Homeownership and Community Lending, Neighborhood Reinvestment Corporation. Participants attended sessions on alternatives for deeply indebted homeowners (titled When It's Really BAD), Section 8 Homeownership, Employer-Assisted Housing and working with Guest Speakers for Homebuyer Workshops. The Oklahoma State University Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service was recognized with the "Friend of OHEA" award at the Membership Meeting and Awards Luncheon. OHEA Awards for Excellence in Homebuyer Education Practices were given to Great Plains Improvement Foundation, Housing Authority of the City of Shawnee and KI BOIS Community Action Foundation.

Hand-N-Hand

OG&E and OKACAA formed a partnership to improve the lives of senior citizens who are OG&E customers in need of weatherization assistance but whose income excludes them from income-based assistance.

OG&E is providing a \$20,000 grant and OKACAA is administering the program. The grant will enable Community Action agencies to weatherize 20-25 homes.

Energy Star

The U.S. Department of Energy provided funding through the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to promote the national Energy Star program. Energy Star is an innovative energy efficiency program sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Through efficient building practices and materials, Energy Star helps homebuyers save money on monthly utility bills while reducing air pollution. The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies promoted the program through distribution of information at the Tulsa House Beautiful and Oklahoma City Home and Garden Show.

Poverty Awareness

OKACAA hosted an orientation session for newly elected state legislators in the Oklahoma House of Representatives chamber to familiarize these policy makers with the efforts of the Community Action network to combat poverty and help low-income persons move toward self-sufficiency. OKACAA also sponsored a Legislative Conference to provide additional opportunities for discussions of issues impacting the clients served by the community action network.

Community Action Solutions, the association's bimonthly newsletter, continued to feature articles on a variety of programs conducted by agencies. The newsletter is distributed via e-mail to policy makers, state and federal agency officials, allied organizations and community action staff members.

A combined annual report and directory compiled by OKACAA supported its efforts to educate Oklahomans about the efforts of Community Action Agencies to address the obstacles facing low-income families who are striving to become self-reliant. The report featured statistical information about agency programs along with key contacts and service locations. The publication is a resource for policy makers, state and federal agency officials, allied organizations, and others who serve the low-income population.

The association maintains a web site as a vehicle to communicate with its various audiences. The newsletter and directory can be accessed on the web site.

OKACAA provided training for volunteer board members on their responsibilities.

Affiliated Housing Organizations

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) administers three housing-related organizations that are tied to its mission of assisting Oklahoma's low income families. Each statewide organization works in different ways to promote homeownership and other housing issues, and brings together a broad coalition of individuals dedicated to helping people, changing lives.

Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association (OHEA) is a statewide coalition of nonprofit and business partners managed by OKACAA that promotes the basic American family values of security, self-sufficiency, and community by enabling a diversity of Oklahomans to pursue homeownership. Down payment, special loan products and other financial assistance for lower- and middle-income families is often tied to homebuyer education. Homebuyer education protects prospective homebuyers by providing them with a process for making good decisions about whether to buy and what to buy, as well as how to work with real estate and mortgage professionals. It acquaints them with their rights under fair credit and fair housing legislation and their responsibilities to protect themselves and their investments. It teaches them to use their earnings and credit history to make a solid investment toward financial security and self sufficiency.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc.

Housing is a major issue for people with disabilities; they are often not given choices about where they live, or with whom and how they spend their time. They are among the most under-served groups in the mortgage and real estate industries, especially when they have lower incomes. Housing options generally consist of their families' homes, congregate facilities, group homes and nursing homes, where housing and services are inextricably linked.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., is a statewide organization developed by the Oklahoma Developmental Disabilities Council whose purpose is to increase the number of people with disabilities who have the opportunity to own their own home, and thereby gain independence and inclusion in the community. The Council continues to provide support funds for the group.

Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., is composed of representatives from various groups: people with disabilities, disabilities advocates, private lenders, real estate firms, state social service agencies, private nonprofits, and housing organizations. Oklahoma Home of Your Own, Inc., serves as an advisory board for the OKACAA's Affordable Homeownership Opportunities for People with Disabilities Program.

Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council

The Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council (OWHAC) is composed of representatives from the housing and weatherization programs operated by community action agencies. OWHAC's mission is to provide technical assistance and training to community action agencies in Oklahoma and to support and promote comfortable, safe, decent and affordable housing throughout the state.

OWHAC annually sponsors the Oklahoma Housing and Energy Conference, which provides training on topics such as electric and gas appliance base loads, rural housing finance, multifamily housing, credit issues, federal housing programs and programs for people with disabilities.

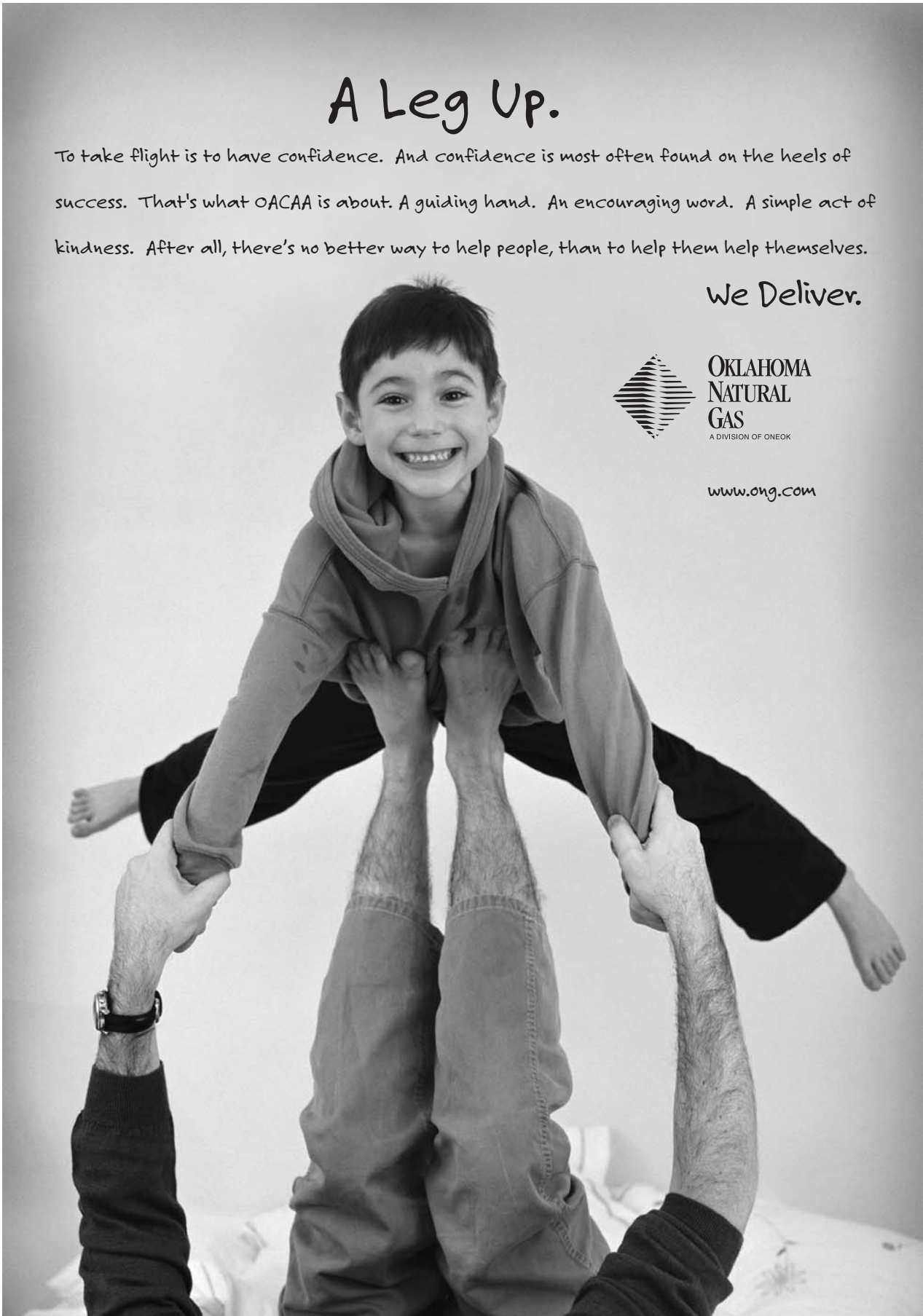

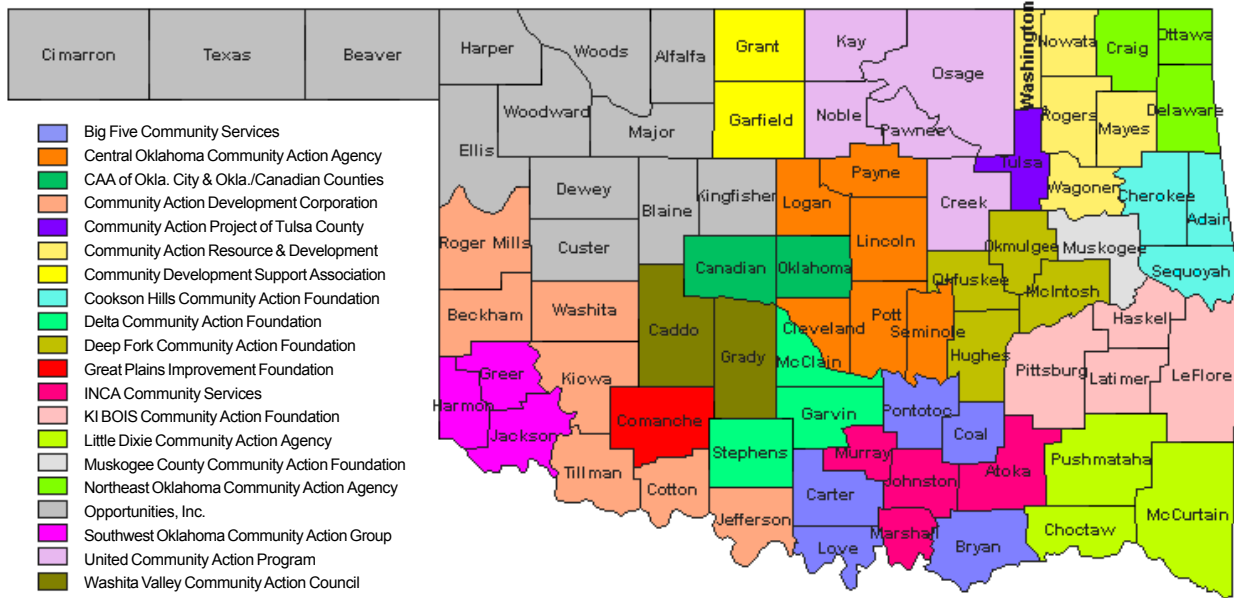
