What Is Community Action?

Community Action Agencies are locally controlled non-profit organizations that work to improve the lives of low-income individuals by creating opportunities for increased self-sufficiency and greater participation in the community. In Oklahoma, Community Action Agencies serve all 77 counties.

One of the strengths of Community Action is its local control and local decision-making. Each board has at least one-third of its membership representing low-income residents, one-third local elected officials or their designees, and the remainder representing local business, civic organizations, faith-based group, and similar interests in the community. Community Action Agencies that have Head Start grants must also have board members who have expertise in fiscal management, early childhood education, and an attorney (or consultants), plus parents of children enrolled in Head Start and additional members selected for expertise in education, business administration, or community affairs. This unique board structure allows each local Community Action Agency to determine the most effective programs based on the needs of communities in its service area.

Each Community Action Agency operates a wide variety of programs that are based upon the needs of each local community which are identified through a needs assessment. Different communities have different needs. The local Community Action Agency responds to the specific needs of each community.

Community Action Agencies provide a broad range of programs. They weatherize homes to reduce a family's energy costs while helping them stay warm in the winter. They provide early childhood programs to help prepare youngsters to succeed in school. They build affordable houses so families can have a home of their own. They help families complete and file their federal and state tax returns free. They provide opportunities for senior citizens to stay active in their communities through volunteer programs. They provide transit programs to get families to medical appointments and workers to jobs. They help the elderly maintain their health through nutrition programs. They help our most vulnerable households avoid loss of essential services through utility payment assistance. They help finance job training programs.

Community Action Agencies receive funding from federal and state appropriations as well as private funding sources. The Federal Community Services Block Grant provides core support. It provides administrative and program support to enable Community Action Agencies to partner with other community organizations to provide needed services.

Community Action Agencies were established under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 to fight America's War on Poverty.

Community Action: Helping People. Changing Lives

Programs and Services

During 2010, members of the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies mobilized the resources of over 4,600 full and part-time employees and nearly \$237 million in federal, state and local funds to help low-income families move toward self-sufficiency. Member agencies:

- •used American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funds to create or save 605 full-time equivalent jobs;
- •assisted 17,122 low and moderate income Oklahomans complete and file their federal income tax returns resulting in \$23,106,894 in federal refunds;
- •provided opportunities for nearly 9,700 children, ages birth to 5, to develop mentally, socially, emotionally and physically through the Early head Start and Head Start programs;
- provided temporary shelter for 1,464 persons;
- assisted 5,627 struggling residents pay their utility bills;
- •assisted 3,357 households reduce energy costs by weatherizing their homes while pumping \$19.9 million in Oklahoma's economy through workers' salaries and purchase of materials from local businesses;
- provided funding for 731 persons to get job training;
- *assisted 1,121 persons prepare to become homeowners by providing homebuyer education classes;
- *served 512,000 nutritious meals at congregate meal sites and delivered another 635,400 meals to residences;
- •assisted 3,153 clients maintain their health by obtaining \$6.9 million in free and discounted prescription drugs through Rx for Oklahoma;
- •provided 1,759,514 passenger trips to jobs, school, medical appointments and shopping using 632 transit vehicles; and
- •provided an opportunity for 3,153 seniors to serve their communities through RSVP and Foster Grandparents programs.

In addition, OKACAA recognizes agency staff members and volunteers for their commitment to helping limited-income families become self-sufficient during the association's annual conference in September.

Head Start Collaboration

The Oklahoma Head Start State Collaboration Office mission is to support efforts to develop early childhood systems and access to comprehensive services for low-income children, and to encourage widespread collaborations between community-based Head Start programs and state early childhood initiatives and policies. The project support collaboration activities in eight priority areas. The following are examples of activities during 2010:

<u>Improving Access to Health Care</u> – The Collaboration Office helped facilitate a continuing medical education training events for physicians, dentists, and Head Start partners at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center in support of the Head Start Dental Home Initiatives.

Improving Collaborations with Family Support Systems – The Collaboration Office electronically distributed resources material to collaboration members including information from the Oklahoma State Department of Health on National Child Abuse Month, Oklahoma Marriage Initiative newsletter, information of the Fatherhood Initiative, and information on a webinar on challenges faced by children of incarcerated parents.

Improving Availability, Accessibility, and Quality of Child Care Services and Preschool Services – The State Director facilitated communications between local Early Head Start and Child Care Services to try to resolve barriers to collaboration.

Expanding and Improving Education Opportunities in Early Childhood – The State Director met with the Assistant State Superintendent, Professional Development Director, and Oklahoma Child Care Resource and Referral Association Executive Director to discuss public schools' system of professional development as it relates to training of others in the early childhood field.

<u>Improving Collaborations Among Community Partners</u> – The Communications Director organized a training track during the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies Legislative Conference that focused on tools and techniques for effectively communicating with target publics. Sessions dealt with working effectively with local news media, practical ideas for a web site, social networking, planning special events, and developing a communications plan.

<u>Improving Access to Family Literacy Services</u> – The State Director facilitated donation of funds to purchase 22 books to be donated to early childhood collaborative programs in the Putnam City School District.

Improving Opportunities for Children with Disabilities – The Collaboration Office electronically distributed a variety of publications to collaboration members including the Focus Facts newsletter from the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center, policy brief from the Education Law Center on including children with disabilities in state pre-k programs, Oklahoma Parents Center newsletter, and Oklahoma Assistive Technology Act program newsletter.

<u>Ensuring Coordination of Services and Support of Homeless Children</u>– The State Director co-chaired the Access to Mainstream Resources Committee of the Governor's Interagency Council on Homelessness.

Head Start Coordination

In a unique program, the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) provides experts to visit Head Start programs to assist with program self-assessment and provide one-on-one technical assistance to help programs prepare for their federal reviews. OKACAA provided this technical assistance to four agencies during 2010. OKACAA contracts with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce for this funding that is provided by the appropriation from the state legislature.

OKACAA staff provides technical assistance and information to the Oklahoma Head Start Association program through monthly meetings with programs directors, program specific training at conferences, and distribution of information and discussion of current issues through an Internet-based information system.

Oklahoma Asset Development Project

OKACAA'S Oklahoma Asset Development Project (OADP) was formed in 2004 as a partnership with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce (ODOC) and the Internal Revenue Service to increase awareness of the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and options for asset development among the working poor. Initially supported by a three-year grant from the Office of Community Services (OCS) to expand outreach and marketing, the project is entering its seventh year providing tax-based services to working families. In the six years since its inception the agencies participating in the program expanded their capacity from 6,058 returns prepared in 2005 to 16,648 in 2010. Earned Income Tax Credits returned to Oklahoma increased from \$3,849,086 to \$9,339,263.

Recognizing the potential impact of the EITC on self sufficiency for Oklahoma's working poor, ODOC added support for site operation. The results were gratifying. For every dollar invested by ODOC in 2010, \$225.84 was generated in refunds for use by Oklahoma's working poor at a preparation cost per return of \$6.06. Additionally, with the cost of paid preparers rising to around \$250/return, nearly \$4 million otherwise spent by families to file tax returns was available to them to meet basic needs.

Fifteen community action agencies continued their participation in the Oklahoma Asset Development Project during the 2010 tax season and one new agency entered the project. Together they operated 88 tax sites in 64 communities across Oklahoma. Their efforts returned \$23,409,912 to Oklahoma, including \$9,339,263 in Earned Income Tax Credits and \$4,105,346 in Child Care Tax Credits. Funds supporting the 2010 tax season were provided by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce (ODOC) and a second, three-year grant from the Office of Community Services (OCS) within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. This second grant funds efforts to partner with the Oklahoma Department of Human Services (DHS) to obtain referrals of TANF and former TANF clients to VITA tax-based service sites. Agencies work with DHS county office directors on a series of outreach steps encouraging the use of sites where asset development, financial literacy, and other programming is made available to support family self sufficiency. A report on the outcomes of the DHS partnership will be available in July 2011.

Program goals are to continue increasing awareness of federal and state earned income tax and child care tax credit eligibility, reduce the amount of tax refunds siphoned off by high-cost financial services and educate working families on how to more effectively manage their money to support self-sufficiency and long-term asset development. Increases in the number of returns and tax preparation dollars saved indicate gains made toward the first two goals. The last goal of educating working families is in process. 933 tax clients were contacted in 2010 regarding interest expressed in financial literacy and asset development. One third of them are working with agencies on those goals.

Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association (OHEA) was established to strengthen Oklahoma communities by enabling more families to own their homes. Programs utilizing homebuyer education target working class and first-time homebuyers, providing them with skills to successfully attain and maintain ownership These programs continue to be successful amid the current setback in the housing and mortgage industries. This is due, in large part, to the policies of Community Action Agencies and other nonprofit housing organizations that require educational workshops, review lending and closing documents and prohibit the use of variable rate mortgages in conjunction with down payment assistance programs.

The Oklahoma Homebuyer Education Association supports these agencies by providing standardized, up-to-date curricula for homebuyer educators. OHEA has certified 349 Certified Homebuyer Education Professionals (CHEPs) over ten years. Last year it provided seven days of professional development and continuing education to ensure CHEPs stayed abreast of all the changes in legislation and industry practices. It also issued six issues of For What It's Worth, an e-newsletter outlining updates and additional opportunities for education to its 212 active members.

Community action agency service providers and their partners certified through OHEA have reported assisting 1,803 low- and moderate-income Oklahomans with their home purchases. Over 17,700 Oklahomans have attended OHEA certified homebuyer education workshops in preparation for ownership.

OHEA also has distributed over \$81,000 in subsidies to agencies providing homebuyer education in rural areas.

OHEA supports the Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council by providing a track of seven sessions on homeownership and financial literacy at their annual State Housing and Energy Conference. CHEPs can meet a portion of their continuing education requirements by attending these sessions which encourages attendance at this event. The association also partners with other agencies through the Oklahoma Jump\$tart Coalition to encourage general financial literacy for youth and adults.

OHEA is funded, in part, by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Topeka and the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies. OHEA certification and continuing education programming is assisted by Dr. Sissy Osteen, CFP®, Associate Professor and Resource Management Specialist with Oklahoma State University. We are grateful to our partner, OSU, for her participation in OHEA's certification programs.

Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council

The Oklahoma Weatherization and Housing Advisory Council (OWHAC) is composed of representatives of the housing and weatherization programs operated by member agencies. OWHAC's mission is to provide technical assistance and training and to promote safe, decent, affordable and comfortable housing throughout the state. It annually sponsors the Oklahoma Housing and Energy Conference that offers training on technical issues and current information on federal and state programs and regulations. OWHAC is an affiliate organization of the Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies.

The weatherization program has expanded with additional funding provided from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. Weatherization improves the energy efficiency of homes that results in lower energy costs. Weatherization programs include:

- U.S. Department of Energy Weatherization Assistance Program
- Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) Weatherization Program
- Utility-sponsored weatherization programs

Housing programs operated by member agencies include:

- Single family construction
- Multifamily housing developments
- · Down payment and closing cost assistance
- Homebuyer education

Poverty Awareness

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) uses a variety of tools to provide information on the services offered by member agencies to help limited-income residents achieve toward self-sufficiency.

OKACAA distributed its 2010 Directory and Annual Performance Report, "Partnering to Promote Self-Sufficiency," to policy makers, 2-1-1 call centers, social service organizations, news media, member agencies and the general public. This 92-page publication included lists of Community Action Agencies with contact information, services, locations of offices plus detailed statistical information on services. It also includes information on all Head Start grantees in the state. Policy makers and others find this publication a valuable tool to learn about services available through the network. Community leaders can obtain insights into the impact of services in their areas from the statistical information in the publication.

OKACAA distributed its bimonthly electronic newsletter, "Community Action Solutions," which contained stories about member programs making a difference in the lives of people. The Association also maintained a website (www.okacaa.org) that included information about programs plus links to other sites.

The communications director provided on-site training to the governing bodies of member agencies to help them understand their responsibilities. Topics covered during these sessions included governing body structure, conflicts of interest, financial oversight responsibilities, role in planning, relationship with the executive director and provisions of Oklahoma's Open Meeting Act.

OKACAA organized a Legislative Conference to help educate state legislators on how policy and funding decisions impact Oklahoma's limited-income families.

OKACAA staff facilitated a Poverty Simulation for the Chickasaw Nation in Ada to help participants understand the challenges families living in poverty must deal with daily. The simulation is an interactive role playing event in which participants assume the roles of different families facing poverty and must interact with community resources. The communications director assisted with a simulation conducted in conjunction with a regional conference of Community Action Agencies held in Austin, Texas.

Strategic Planning

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) provided training and technical assistance to member agencies on strategic planning. The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funded program focused on assisting agencies develop local strategic plans and to develop plans to publicize use of ARRA funds locally.

OKACAA included a full-day session on "Strategic Planning for the Statewide Coordination of Community Services Block Grant Recovery Act Efforts" during its Summer Conference.

Communications training was provided during the Legislative Conference held in March and the Annual Conference held in September. Training focused on providing member agency staff with practical tools for publicizing ARRA supported projects. Conference sessions include sessions on working with the media, improving web sites, event planning, social networking, strategic communications, crisis communications, printing techniques, communicating across cultures, egovernment services, newsletter design, and creating a brochure. Three member agencies received technical assistance in developing communications plans.

Weatherization Client Education

The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) provides a statewide system for Weatherization Client Education in Oklahoma. The system capitalizes on American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) funds to inform and educate as many income-eligible consumers as possible about energy conservation practices and cost-saving measures that can reduce overall residential energy consumption in addition to what weatherization achieves.

Community Action Agencies offer client education to occupants of weatherization eligible dwelling units within their service area. Targeted populations include low-income schools, high energy use households, Head Start families, seniors, families that include members with disabilities and other families with small children. Energy Educators provide consumer education locally in a variety of ways including group training events, one-on-one client education while visiting weatherized homes, presentations to consumer-focused meetings; and educational materials at local events or gatherings.

OKACAA provides training and technical assistance to the educator network, develops partnerships within the energy provider industry, and extends the reach of the program through the Head Start Collaboration in conjunction with the financial literacy priority. To date, OKACAA has provided 29 training sessions for 139 energy educators and weatherization staff from all nineteen agencies offering the Weatherization Assistance Program. They, in turn, have provided energy efficiency education to 3,144 people receiving weatherization services and over 3,361 program-eligible Oklahomans attending group sessions in 2010. OKACAA staff and energy educators provided energy-saving tips in face-to-face encounters with over 7,000 attendees at the 2010 State Fair of Oklahoma. Educators have reported outreach to over 38,500 Oklahomans at local and regional fairs and venues.

The program is funded by ARRA funds from the Department of Energy (DOE) Weatherization Assistance Program as administered by the Oklahoma Department of Commerce.

Weatherization Training and Technical Assistance

During 2010 a large percentage of training focused on bringing agencies into compliance with the EPA Lead requirements along with requirements of the Department of Energy (DOE) Lead Safe Rule. The Oklahoma Association of Community Action Agencies (OKACAA) also conducted training during the association's conferences. Classes included Infrared Camera Training, Field Safety Training, Health and Safety Training, Mobile Home Training, and both Basic and Advanced NEAT training.

OKACAA initiated a training program that will allow agency employees to attend training that will certify them through the Building Performance Institute (BPI) in different areas of building analysis.

Training was provided to 260 on the Renovator and DOE Lead Safe and 13 on BPI.


